ampliest and State of Virginia do make this writing as and for my last Will  
and Testament as follows: I leave unto my wife Prance Brister all  
my estate both real and personal except the Land that I bought of  
Willis Bowing & that part of my Land I give to my son Benjamin  
Brister at my death for and during her natural life or widowhood should  
she marry. My desire is that she have one third of my estate for life as  
the law directs: I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Brister  
that part of my Land and plantation lying on the east side of a wash  
tree that stands in the plantation my wish is that a straight line be  
made North and South from Adelbert Stephenson's line to Blas Butters  
my feather bed and furniture one half of my still pot and dinner  
one half of my Cedar Suckers apple mill and one Pew to him and his  
heirs forever: I give and bequeath unto my son James Brister all  
that part of my Land & plantation lying on the West side of the wash  
tree above named. and Negro Man Brown one feather bed & furniture one  
half of my still pot and dinner & one of my apple mill & ditch bank  
to him and his heirs forever:

I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas J. Brister my Daughter  
Polly Camp and my Grand Daughter Mary Ann Powell the remainder  
of my estate not heretofore named to be equally divided between them  
but should my Grand daughter Mary Ann Powell die before she arrives  
to the age of twenty one years, or without an heir lawfully begotten of  
her own body my desire is that part of my property falling to her  
be equally divided between my children who named: I nominate  
and appoint my son Thomas J. Brister and my friend Alon Edwards my  
executors to the my last Will and Testament involving all other Wills  
or Wills by me heretofore made: to bear under my Hand and seal this  
21<sup>st</sup> day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine.
