 1st I give all my just Doble:
 2nd I Give my wife Percy W. Kimbrell the plantation whereon I now live including the Williams, the Vick, and the McNials tracts: I also give her one third of all my money and bonds due my estate, when after my estate being settled, I also have her one third of my Negro slaves during her natural life:
 3rd I Give my son David W. Parck W. & Elizabeth S. Kimbrell also to the child which is not yet borned, one thousand four hundred Dollars to each one of them making five thousand six hundred Dollars to be divided between the four children:
 4th I Give my Daughter Maria J. Kimbrell four hundred Dollars:
 5th If I have Should not be money enough to the amount which I have given away, to my children my wish is for Negroes to be valued, to make that amount without selling them to make the amount of money which I have given away to my children:
 6th My desire is that all the balance of my estate to be equally divided
