twenty one years of age: The share which I have loved my wife Peggy
at her death is to be equally divided between John J. Swinn H.,
Sarah V. and Elizabeth Kinderdine and the child which is not yet born:
if either of the above named children should die before the death of my
wife my wish is that the portion which that child or children would
receive at her death to be equally divided between all of my surviving
children or their lawful issue of their body: In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal in presence of
witnesses before I signed: I leave my son John J. Kinderdine and
Benjamin B. Kinderdine my Executors to this my last Will and
Testament.
