

✓ *Shrubs and orchard to be Recorded.**Isabel L.R. Edwards &c*

This is my first and last Will and Testament: It is my request if life should not last that all my just debts may be paid out of the said property of which I may be bound to hand and after so doing if I have no children of my own or wife, and there should be any left, it is my wish and also desire that my small estate should not be divided into different parts, but that the said estate may all be given to Wm. Thomas, a child which are bequeathed to Benjamin and Annandale, but reason why I do this is because I do not wish any disturbance made over the said property, after my death, and the estate being so small that satisfaction cannot be given without this is done: I do not wish the said negroes Phebe and Martha to be sold belonging to me but that they may live and do all they can for their little Master William Thomas so long as they remain under their good behaviour and mind what is said to them on all occasions without being whipped to punish for their bad conduct: This is my very last will and forever, that it may be done as directed:

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 19th day of December 1849. A Writing purporting the last Will and Testament of Benjamin & Griffin did was produced in Court, and there being no subscribing Witness to said writing, Richard W. Clayton, George W. Sperry, and Benjamin J. Griffin being duly sworn deposited and say that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Benjamin & Griffin; and truly believe the body of the said writing, as well as the signature of the said Benjamin & Griffin to the said writing to be wholly in the hand writing of the said Benjamin & Griffin and whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be Recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Benjamin & Griffin did: And there being no Executor named in said Will: And the Motion of William H. Griffin who made oath and together with Squire Griffin and Children his Executors entered into and acknowledged at bond in the penalty of twenty five hundred Dollars, conditioned as the Law directs: Satisfaction is granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the Estate of the said Benjamin & Griffin did with his Will & Testament annexed as last found
