On the 1st day of July A.D. 1849, before me the undersigned Clerk of the District Court, in and for the parish of Madison, aforesaid, personally came and appeared Benjamin R. Thomas of the County of Warren and State of Mississippi who presented to me the said Clerk, the Last Will and Testament of Nathaniel Williams and the said Will was solemnly but not read, with at the same time personally appeared Junius Amis and John C. Emper both residents of the parish of Madison, aforesaid, each of whom being first duly sworn as follows: "I depose & declare as follows" "I depose the Will of Nathaniel Williams which is presented to me, and also the Codicil thereto as being voluntarily made, dated and signed in the Testator's hand writing as I have often seen him write and sign during his lifetime."
