 of Virginia, do hereby make this my last will and Testament revoking
 all others in manner and form following—
 1st—I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be sold as soon
 after my decease as practicable, and out of the proceeds thereof all my
 just debts be paid.
 And I give to my son James Lenow, now of the State of Tennessee one thousand
 Dollars, but on these conditions, that as a Law suit is now pending in the Court
 of Appeals at Richmond, in which Jacob Lenow is Plaintiff and I am de-
 fendant, should judgment go against me, then the amount of that judgment
 is to come out of the one thousand Dollars above mentioned as given to my
 son James Lenow and his heirs forever—
 And I give to my son Joseph Lenow also of the State of Tennessee one Dollar.
