But should either of them die before reaching twenty one without leaving children, I wish his, her or their portion to be equally divided among my children and their heirs.

I wish my executors hereafter named, to spare no expense in giving all of my children the best opportunities to receive the most liberal education which their capacities will admit. The means or money for carrying this fully out, I wish raised from my estate.

It is my desire and earnest request that my executor and assistant executors shall at some very early day after my demise remove the mortal remains of my former wife Maria Antoinette Wigham from the family coffin of Trilate Thomas Will of North Carolina and place it by my side in the cemetery of my family.

If it shall be the desire of my wife Rebecca Louisa Wigham to remain at my residence Warrigue, I leave it to the discretion of my executor to make any arrangements with her which may meet their views.

And last I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother Richard A. Wigham executor, and further constitute and appoint my brother Charles F. Wigham and brother Anselm B. Wigham to be his assistant executors of this my last will and testament.
