I, The Name of Lord, Ann^l C. Simpson C. Rec^d of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, being weak in body, but of sound mind and disposing memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, hereby revoking all others, To wit:-

Item 1st I commit my body into the hands of my friends to be buried by them and my soul I commend to my Maker who gave it.

2^d My will and desire is that my executors to be hereafter named, shall sell as their judgment may dictate to them in best advantage time before sale terms &c. The plantation on which I now live known as the Broggs Keys.

3^d My will and desire is that my executors sell on terms to suit themselves as regards the time of selling either privately or publicly and on time to suit themselves &c. my plantation lying on the Meherrin River in the County of Southampton North Carolina and Southampton Virginia, also the tract of Land I purchased of Eldridge C. Magee known as the Court place, and adjoining the above named place and that they sell also on terms at their discretion all the balance of my estate of every description save and except my negro slaves.

Item 4th I give unto my beloved wife Mary Anne the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to her and to her heirs forever, the same to be paid to her by my executors out of the proceeds of the sale of my abovesaid lands to be paid to her in equal instalments every abovesaid land instalment man-
hence due, I also come to my wife Mary Anne during her natural life one third of my negro slaves and at her death I give the same to be equally divided between
