5th I give all my revenues not herein before to my wife Mary Reese to be equally divided between my aforesaid three children Helen E. Reese, Walter E. Reese, and Rosa Reese to them and each of them and their heirs forever.

6th It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid and if after that a balance shall remain in the hands of my executors then I give the same to be equally divided between my said three children Helen E. Reese, Walter E. Reese and Rosa Reese to them and each of them, and their heirs forever.

7th I give to my three children Helen E. Reese, Walter E. Reese and Rosa Reese all my right title and interest in certain tracts of land now in the possession of Charlotte Gilman of Essex County, Virginia, which right was acquired by me in my matrimony with Mary T. Gilman daughter of Henry R. Gilman dec^d of the aforesaid County of Virginia, to them and each of them and their heirs forever.

8th My will and desire is that if either one of my aforesaid three children shall die before he or she shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years or before their marriage, then and in that case I will that each ones portion of my estate of every kind be equally divided between the surviving ones to them and their heirs forever, and if all of them shall die before their marriage or before they are of lawful age, I then and in that case give the same to my beloved wife Mary Reese to her and her heirs forever.

9th Reposing special trust and confidence in my worthy friends Mark E. Seate and Edward P. Turner, I hereby constitute and appoint them my Executors to this my last will and Testament.

I, William Bowden of the county of Southampton do on this 12th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, make constitute, appoint this my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:

First, I give and bequeath to my daughter Cordelia Adams a bond that I now hold against her for the sum of one hundred and sixty dollars and eighty eight cents on the 3rd day of August 1845, to her and her heirs forever.

Secondly, I give to my son Cartwell B. Bowden all my land and plantation called The Grove plantation, also my low ground field all below a line running from Spence Grove corner to the head of a branch near a Walnut tree
