I Abraham L. Gardner of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do hereby certify that on the 1st day of October One thousand eight hundred and fifty one, make, constitute and appoint this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:-

First, After the payment of my debts, I give to my wife Susan, the fifth of my personal and chattel estate, to her and her heirs. I loan to her my House and Land for five years. I also give to her the provisions for one years support.

I give to Frankling, my Gold Watch and Chain.

My monies estate I divide equally among my wife and four children, namely, Cornelia, Frankling, Orogenia, Abraham. I desire at the expiration of five years

that this House and Land should be valued and that my son Frankling should pay over to the other legates, the amount and take possession of it.

My wife is to share equal in this amount paid for the House and Land.

The remainder of my estate I divide equally among my four children, namely, Cornelia, Frankling, Orogenia and Abraham.

Lastly, I nominate and appoint my particular friend Joseph J. Lawrence for executor to this my last will and testament.

In witness where off, I set my hand and seal, this thirtyeth day of October Eighteen Hundred and fifty one.
