

In said Bequest, 3 single &c. & 6 plow horses, 15 plow hoes, 6 Cattle, and plow gear for the
same, one Tree saw, wheel and spoke, one waggon and gear, 6 End hoes, 6 axes, 6
do and shovels, and a horse that the said plantation shall be kept up with negroes
till & towards for the benefit of the children of said plantation until the eldest one of
them arrived to the age of twenty one years old, and that then an equal division
of either of the children should - of his such division before arriving at twenty
years of age his, her or their portion as the case may be shall go to the
survivor or survivors.

10th. I give and bequeath unto Henry B. Vaughan son of Charles N. Vaughan
of Mississippi five thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

11th. I give and bequeath unto Ann C. Vaughan daughter of said Charles N.
Vaughan five thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

12th. I give and bequeath unto my friend Elphab Adams five thousand dollars to him
and his heirs forever.

13th. I give and bequeath unto my niece Mary C. Vaughan my negro girl Mary and
five thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

14th. I give and bequeath unto Thomas Vaughan all the lands wherein I live lying in the
parish of the roads leading to Cross Keys and Bedford, and the following places
viz. Margaret and her children Betty of Son, Child, Henry, Manuel &
Frank, which he has over at Mrs. Debuys, all my horses all my household
furniture, all my china, crockery ware, and silver spoons, all my tools, plows
and traps, the balance of my cattle, and wheels, all my ploughs year &
not before given away, and thuthor half of my fold pens and pens,
my boiler, cotton gin and gear, running wheels, 2000 lbs of pork, all the
doves and pigeons and small fowls, in the lot at the house out at the gate
at the old pen, and at the new ground pen, 200 lbs of Corn, 10000 lbs of rice
and the other half of my Topi fodder, and shovels, 30 head of cattle 2 yoke
of Steers, an yoke, 6 plow hoes, 3 Cattle and the balance of my Raiments
& End hoes, the balance of my wearing hoes, and five thousand dollars
to him and his heirs forever.

15th. I give and bequeath unto Henry N. Swinton five thousand dollars, but in case
he should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years, I give the said
five thousand dollars to his brother and sisters in the same way as herebefore
named to them and their heirs forever.

16th. I give and bequeath unto Edward Foster the balance of my estate, but in case
he should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I give the same
balance to George Rose, Andrew Rose, and Virginia Rose to them
and their heirs forever.

Lastly, I appoint my friends, Thomas Reddy and Samuel Swany, executors
of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal, This 10 day of July 1851
