

In four Parcels, 3 single & 1 three panes, 15 plow horses, 4 Carts, and plow gear for the same, One Star Barn, wheel and yoke, one waggon and gear, 6 Bush hoes, 6 axes, 6 working hoes, and one half of the sets and plow and gear and one half of the top gear for two Shucks and a Star that the said plantation shall be kept up with negroes hired & furnished for the benefit of the children generated until the said one of them arrives to the age of twenty one years old, and that then in equal division of the same be made between them or such of them as may be then living. If either of the children should after such division before arriving at twenty one years of age his, her or their portion as the case may be shall go to the surviving or survivor.

12th I give and bequeath unto Henry B. Vaughan son of Charles N. Vaughan of Mississippi Five thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

13th I give and bequeath unto Anna B. Vaughan daughter of said Charles N. Vaughan Two thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

13th I give and bequeath unto my friend Ogall a sum of thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

13th I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha C. Vaughan my razor gear Trays and five thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

14th I give and bequeath unto Thomas Vaughan all the lands wherein I am lying with both of the roads leading to Cross Keys and Bedford, and the following slaves viz. Margaret and two children Betty & Jim, Buck, Henry, Manuel & Hank, which he has one at Mrs Debney's, all my horses all my household furniture, all my chins, crockery ware, and silver spoons, all my tubs, pails, and Trays, the balance of my carts, and wheels, all my ploughs, gears & not before given away, and another half of my polo, horses and cows, my干涉 cotton gin and gear, running water, 2000 lbs of pork, all the slaves and pigs and small flocks, in the lot at the house out at the gate at the old pen, and at the new pens pen, 350 lbs of Corn, 12000 lbs fodder and the other half of my Log fodder, and Shucks, 30 lbs of cattle 20 yds of Sheets, an yoke, 6 plow horses, 3 Carts and the balance of my Pimflames & Club horses, the balance of my washing pens, and Ten thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

15th I give and bequeath unto Henry V. Donisthorpe five thousand dollars, but in case he should die before he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, I give the said five thousand dollars to his brother and sister in the same way as herefore named to them and their heirs forever.

16th I give and bequeath unto Esther Moxley the balance of my estate, but in case he should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I give the said balance to George Rose, Andrew Rose and Virginia Rose to them and their heirs forever.

17th I appoint my friends, Thomas Eddle and Samuel Gray, executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand and affix my seal, the 10 day of July 1857
