The Exor states specially that the creek plantation owned by him & his late father to be sold and the proceeds divided equally among his five female legates was sold with the 30th Decr. 1848. for the sum of \$470. payable in equal payments in six, twelve and eighteen months. On order to settle the estate without the sale of any of the slaves, the Exor received the land money in cash & deducting the Int: amounting to \$2839.50 with which he is charged in the above account and applies the same to the payment of the debts. The whole of the above bal. therefore is due the five female legates in the will to replace the land money used in paying the debts. It will be observed in the above account that the assets were not sufficient to pay the debts without using a portion of the land money; and as the balance is not sufficient to pay the five above named legates, the whole of what they are entitled to from the proceeds of the land it is necessary that each of them shall lose and the other legates in the will pay an equal proportion of the deficiency. The following statement will show the legates' account with the Exor.
