

Harris, George W. Harris, and Lewis C. Harris to be equally divided between them all I also leave to my wife Sarah C. Harris the following slaves Simon, Edmund, Wilson woman Siby and girl Priscilla during her life, and at her death then the said slaves and their increase if any to be valued and equally divided between all my above named children.

Item 3d. It is my desire that at the death of my wife, the plantation which I have leave a lot be sold on a credit of twelve months and the money arising therefrom to be divided in the following manner (viz) Martha A. Harris to receive three hundred dollars less than my two younger children George and Lewis; Charlie T. Harris to receive three hundred dollars less and the balance to be equally divided between George W. Harris and Lewis C. Harris, my two daughters having the advantage in bond and tuition.

Item 4th. It is my desire that all my personal estate except my slaves be sold on a credit of nine months, and the money arising from such sale and all the money due me from all other sources, shall by my be kept at interest on good security the sum hundred dollars given to my wife; my debt and general expenses being first paid, the balance to be equally divided among my children, Martha Anne Harris, Charlie T. Harris, George W. Harris and Lewis C. Harris to be paid to them as they may or ariue to lawful age, my children to be well clothed and educated.

Item 5th. I also desire that my executor here out yearly the balance of my slaves and their increases which is not owing to my wife for the benefit of all my children above named, to be equally between them all as they may or ariue to lawful age, the slaves to be equally divided also as above directed between my children.

Item 6th. If either of my children should die before they attain to lawful age or many and has lawful issue, then in that case the part which I have given to that shall be equally divided between my surviving children.

Item 7th. If all my said children should die without lawful issue and under the age of twenty one years, then I give the property herein given to all them, to the children of brother James Harris.

Item 8th. I nominate, constitute and appoint brother James Harris executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 25th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two.
