In the name of God, amen: I, Nathan B. Bryant, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do make and administer to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, viz:

Item 1. All of my land and chattel estate I leave to be sold and for all of my just debts to be paid out of the amount of sales of the same.

Item 2. I give to Elvira Hunt child of Mary Hunt deceased, the sum of one thousand dollars to be held by my executors to be hereinafter named and the interest to be yearly applied to her support until she arrives at the age of eighteen years, and at that time she is to be sent to any free state that my said executors may think most beneficial to her future benefit, and in the event of her death before arriving to the age of eighteen years or her refusing to go where she may be sent by my said executors to be named hereafter, the thousand dollars to revert back to my estate and be disposed of as the part of my estate that is to be equally divided between the children of my sister Martha Davis that she had by Noble Everett, Edward L. Everett, Allen B. Everett, and Caleb Everett and all of the children of sister Mary D. Deberry, that she may have at my death.

Item 3. I give to Adeline Freeman child of Elvira Brown the sum of five hundred dollars on the same terms, that I give the thousand dollars to Elvira Hunt and to revert back to my estate on the same terms and conditions and to be disposed of in the same manner as provided for in her case in the event of her happening in her case.

Item 4. I leave my Negroes Harriet, George, Mary and Ivy together with the negroes that may yet be the death of my mother, all to be sold and out of the same I give to Edward L. Everett, Allen B. Everett and Caleb Everett the sum of three thousand dollars to be equally divided between them.

Item 5. I give all of the remainder of my estate to be equally divided between Edward L. Everett, Allen B. Everett, Caleb Everett, and all of the children of my sister Mary D. Deberry, wife of Samuel Deberry now of Tennessee, each to share and share alike.

Item 6. I leave James D. Bryant and Robert S. Jones my executors to the my last will and testament, made and signed by me this eighth day of November, Eighteen hundred and fifty three, in presence of

Joseph B. Whitehead.
