I, Kinchen Williams, of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia, do make and ordain this
 my last will in the manner following to-wit:

I leave to my wife Rebecca during her life one third part of my estate (and I also give her
 one bed and furniture to dispose of as she thinks proper.

1st I give to my son Kinchen Williams the tract of land on which I now reside, and also a small
 portion of thirty six acres, the two tracts being all the real estate. I also give him
 of my bed and furniture, one shot gun now in the possession of Frank Bess and the following
 washings, Dick, Tom and Dorcas, to him and his heirs forever.

2nd I give to my son Elisha, two horses which I now hold against Dr. Swill and W^m A.
 Jones amounting to about eight hundred dollars. And also one bed and furniture, I give to
 my son Jacob two slaves (Edy & Dose, also one sord man and one bed and furniture
 and all my plantation tools.

I give to my daughter Jane one bed and furniture, and my daughter is to have the right to
 remain in my house (and to be supported free of any charge, until she shall marry.

It is my will and desire that at the death of my wife all the property (except the
 not hereinbefore disposed of as well as the remaining portion of my stock of every kind
 after my wife's third part shall have been apportioned her shall be equally divided
 in kind between my sons Kinchen, Elisha and Jacob, it being my wish for my wife
 not to have any sale of my property.

Lastly, I nominate my sons Kinchen and Jacob Executors of this my last will.
 In witness whereof, I have set my hand and seal this 8th day of June 1854.
