The Commissioners have been requested by the executors to state specially that soon after the death of their testator the widow of Henry Kindred had her share of the land (and negro belonging) to the estate allotted to her by a decree of the County Court of Southampton and that all the land rent and negro hire which they have received after the payment of debts be paid to their testator's children.
