

At a Court held for the County of Southampton, the 30th day of November 1854.
 D^r W^m Cobb, Commissioner of this Court, having returned an account of the transactions of
 W^m J. Schell, (son of Micajah P. Cole deceased), and also an account of all debts or demands
 against Micajah P. Cole deceased, or his estate, and said accounts having been introduced
 before our Bench and jury (and no exceptions having been filed thereto), are confirmed,
 by the Court, and ordered to be recorded. And it appearing to the Court from
 said accounts that there are not sufficient assets in the hands of the said W^m J. Schell
 son of Micajah P. Cole deceased, to pay all the debts against the estate of
 the said Micajah P. Cole deceased, it is adjourned ordered and directed that the said
 Commissioner deposit the amount due from the said Administrator amongst the
 several creditors who have produced their debts as aforesaid, that he ascertain
 the amount due each and make report thereof, to this Court with any matters
 especially that shall become pertinent by himself or which he may be required so to do
 by either of the parties.

In the Name of God, Amen! I, Joel Prince of the County of Southampton, do make and
 ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows:
 Item 1st. It is my wish that my Executor pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as
 specified as possible and have the whole of my estate valued by good and competent men
 except my interest in negro woman Lucy.

Item 2^d. It is my will (and desire) that my Executor hereinafter named do sell all the pork
 and bacon for cash, and that he do also sell all my landed estate on such time
 as he may decent best.

Item 3rd. I give to my beloved wife Mary my Interest in negro woman Lucy, one Bureau, one
 bed and furniture and one fifth part of the valuation of my estate both real and personal
 except said woman Lucy to be paid to her in money as soon as it is raised from
 the estate, to her and her heirs forever.

Item 4th. I give my daughter Martha P. Prince one bed and furniture and thirteen hun-
 dred dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item 5th. The balance of my estate now in my possession I give to be equally
 divided between my daughters Elizabeth Hobart and Martha P. Prince to them
 and their heirs forever.

And lastly, I do constitute and appoint my son-in-law Samuel L. Wood my Executor
 to this my last will and testament. Signed, sealed and acknowledged in the

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of November 1854.
 This last will and testament of Joel Prince deceased was this day proved by the oaths of
 John Williams, Oliver M. Sykes, & W^m P. Prince the subscriber witnesses thereto (and
 sworn to be made). And on the motion of Samuel L. Wood, the Executor therein named
 was made such (and together with James E. Price & Benjamin Prince (who justified
 in each act this sufficiently) ordered into (and acknowledged above the penalty
 of twenty five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate
 is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due
 time.)
