 ordain this my last will and testament in presence and form as follows:
 Firstst It is my desire that my Executor pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as
 speedily as possible and have the whole of my estate valued by good and competent men
 except my interest in negro woman Lucy.

2nd It is my will and desire that my Executor hereinafter named do sell all the pork
 and butter for cash, and that he do also sell all my landed estate or such like
 as he may deem best.

Next^{3rd} I give to my beloved wife Mary my Interest in negro woman Lucy, on Bureau, or
 bed and furniture and one fifth part of the valuation of my estate both real and personal
 except said woman Lucy to be paid to her in money as soon as it is raised from
 the estate, to her and her heirs forever.

Then^{4th} I give my daughter Martha B. Prince one bed and furniture and thirteen hun-
 dred dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Then^{5th} The balance of my estate now in my possession I give to be equally
 divided between my daughters Elizabeth Wood and Martha B. Prince to them
 and their heirs forever.

And lastly, I do constitute and appoint my son-in-law Samuel C. Wood my Executor
 to this my last will and testament. Signed, sealed and acknowledged in the
