

With the name of God, Amen! I, Nancy Pope of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, being of sound mind (and) understanding and knowing the substance of this life (and) the certainty of death do hereby make my last will (and) testament in the following manner:

Item 1st. I give to my son Amos S. Pope the clock and Loom that he has now in his possession belonging to the together all other articles that he may have in his possession belonging to me, also one Chair Blank (and) an washstand that is at Eliza Pope's now to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2nd. I give to my son Richard Barrett the sum of one Dollar to him and his heirs forever.

Item 3rd. I give to my sons Amos Pope, Madison Pope, Oswald Pope, Richard Pope and Isaac S. Pope my large Bed and furniture for the use of the abovesamed for children and their heirs forever.

Item 4th. I give to my sons Amos Pope, Madison Pope, Oswald Pope, Eliza Pope Amos S. Pope, Richard Pope and Isaac S. Pope all of my right or Interest in the Doctor Land now in the possession of Mrs. Dicey Pope to them (and) their heirs forever. And my wish concerning the Land is this that after my death if a majority of the above named several children should agree for the land to remain as it is without settling it until the death of Mrs. Dicey Pope at which time they will have a simple right in the Land. I would prefer this doing so, but if a majority cannot agree to let it remain they are at liberty to do as they think proper about it.

Item 5th. I give to my son Eliza Pope all of the balance of my property (and) not disposed of above that I leave in his possession of which him (and) his heirs forever.

Item 6th. Should my Executor find a paper in my possession that requires my children to pay to me a certain amount of money annually, I do not desire any thing more paid in it at no time more than what I receive during my life even if I do not receive the sum annually which the paper requires them to pay. But I desire my seven sons sometimes in turn the 1st for each one to pay his proportionable part of my Doctor's bills and burial expenses.

I hereby name, note (and) appoint Eliza Pope, Executor to this my last will (and) testament revoking all former wills heretofore made by me and do hereby acknowledge this to be my last will (and) testament, this 26th day of June 1854.
