

3. After paying all my just debts out of the residue of my estate, I desire whatever may remain to be equally divided between the children of Everett A. Case, Jr.,
4. I desire above I hold against Edwin Daugherty to be given to him without his
making any further payment on the same.
- 5th I desire my friend Edwin Daugherty to act as my executor in carrying out
this my last will according to the true intent and meaning thereof.

At almost half past the hour of Southampton the 18th day of February 1856.
This last will and testament of Wiley Britt dec'd, was this day proved by the oaths of
George W. Peck of Lawrence C. Daugherty, two of the subscribing witnesses above named,
and the court ordered to be recorded. And in the motion of Edwin Daugherty the execu-
tor herein named, who made oath and gave bond and security according to law, certificated
is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Last Will and Testament of Mrs. Jane Case.

Item first. I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Mary Jane Case, eldest daughter
of my son Everett A. Case, the tract of land wherein I now live with the improvements,
also my negro boy Melvin aged about two years, provided she leave lawfull issue.
In case she should die without lawfull issue I give the said land and negro boy in
my half to my son Everett A. Case, and the other moiety or half to the children of my
daughter Sarah Jane Maget wife of Arthur C. Maget and their heirs.

Item Second. I loan to my daughter Sarah Jane Maget during her life the tract of land
whereon Arthur C. Maget now lives, also all the property which is conveyable
of trust by Arthur C. Maget for my benefit (and which is less than his personalty) the
said debt and land included therein & hereby assigned over to my executor with whom he should
and at her death I give the said land and other property to her children, also I lend
my said daughter one negro her choice of my negroes, during her life and at her death
give the said negro to her children as above.

Item Third. I give to my granddaughter Indiana T. Johnson, late Mrs. Cornelia A.
Britt, late Mrs. Antoinette M. Case, and my grandsons Everett M. B. Case my negro
boy Isaac, one feather bed and furniture and clock, one walnut table, one paneled
one washstand, two earthen vases, one large iron pot, one spinning wheel &
cradle, chair and share alike.

Item 4th. I give to my grandson Everett M. B. Case out of my estate the sum of one
hundred & fifty dollars \$150.00 to my granddaughter Antoinette M. Case the sum
of One hundred dollars (and my negro girl Harriet (provided she leave lawfull
issue as to Harriet.) In case she die without lawfull issue this will fail
Harriet I give to her brother Everett M. B. Case.

Item 5th. I desire that all the balance of my negroes be equally divided into two equal
parts, one moiety I expect I loan to my daughter Sarah Jane Maget during her life
and at her death I give the said negroes and their increase to such of her children
as may arrive to lawfull age or leave lawfull issue also I give to my
daughter Sarah Jane Maget my negroes and their increase.

Item 6th. The other remaining moiety or half of my negroes I give to my granddaughter

Mary Jane Case provided she leaves lawfull issue. Then in case she die without
lawfull issue of her body I give said negroes and their future increase to such of her children
as my son Everett A. Case, the other half to the children of my daughter Sarah Jane Maget.

Item 7th. I request that all the balance of my property be sold with the aid of
and after paying my just debts and all reasonable expenses the balance remain-
ing if any to be divided equally, one moiety to my daughter Sarah Jane Maget.
