Secondly, I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Mary Jane Carr eldest daughter of my son Corveth A. In case she should die without lawful issue I give the said land and negro boy, one moiety or half to my son Corveth A. Second. I leave to my daughter Sarah Jane Maget during her life the trust of land whereon Arthur C. Maget now lives, also all the property which is conveyed by deed of trust by Arthur C. Maget for my benefit (and which is now in his possession) the said deed and bond included therein & hereby assigned over to my executor with all interest and at her death I give the said land and other property to her children, also I leave my said daughter one negro her choice of my negroes, during her life and at her death I give the said negro to her children as above.

Item third. A gift to my granddaughters Indiana V. Johnson, late Bond, Cornelia A. Peitch, late Bond, Antoinette M. Bond, and my grandson Everett M.D. Bond my rings, my gown, one feather bed and furniture in a clock, one walnut table one pine table one washstand, two earthen bowls, one large iron pot, new spinning wheel an easel, shawl and shawl alike.
