This account of Nathaniel Simmons' Executive Proceedings on the estate of  
Edward L. Simmons late and also distributee accounts were returned unfiled  
for exceptions. And at a Court held for the said County, the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June  
1856. The said account having been one month and upwards in the  
Clerk's Office and there being no exceptions thereto, were examined, confirmed  
and adjudged to be recorded.

I, John Davis, of the County of Suffolk State of N.Y. do make this my last will  
and Testament in manner & form as follows, viz:

Section 1<sup>st</sup>. I lend unto my wife during her natural life all my Dens, together  
with all my slaves & their increase, I also lend her all my crops now or here  
after the Barley, all my Household & Kitchenfurniture, all my stock of horses,  
Mules, Hogs, cattle, Sheep, & their increase, all my plantation utensils, but if  
the Banks prosper, she can sell any part of the stock or crops for her own use.  
Sect: 2<sup>d</sup>. I give unto my son Mervt J. Davis at my wife's death my manor land  
I also give him my manor House & one bed, he having had his Partal  
& Bed in prospect, but if the Bay Comt Should die before he get prospect of them  
then Mervt. Crosby & Davis to raise four Hundred Dollars & to give to Mervt.

Sect: 3<sup>rd</sup>. At my wife's death I give unto my son Mervt J. Davis all my land  
lying on the south side of the Smithfield road. I also give him my house, also  
my stills, casks of all my cedar works. I also give unto my Daughter Crosby, One  
Bed & furniture. I give unto my son Maddison one Bed & furniture.

Sect: 4<sup>th</sup>. At my wife's Death I give unto my Daughter Jessie J. Davis my Roof  
Iope, One feather Bed, & furniture all the extra Bed furniture that she has not  
Y called hers, also one large Chest marked M. & C.

Sect 5<sup>th</sup>. At my wife's Death I give unto my Grand Daughter Marietta J. Davis  
my manor Spreatty, but if she should die without leaving a child, then the  
manor Spreatty is to return to my estate and be equally Divided among my  
children. I also leave her one Hundred Dollars upon the same terms  
as the manor Spreatty.

Sect 6<sup>th</sup>. At my wife's Death, all the Slaves I have loaned to her if not otherwise  
in her power of is to be divided equally between my Daughter Crosby & my  
Daughter Jessie J. Davis. If there should be any money due me after  
paying my debts I leave it to be divided between Mervt, my Daughter Crosby &  
my Daughter Jessie.

Sect 7<sup>th</sup>. At my wife's Death, all the property not otherwise disposed of  
I leave to be sold out of which together with any money due, paying my debts & expenses  
and the surplus of any, to be divided between my son Mervt, my son Mervt  
& my Daughter Crosby & my Daughter Jessie, but if the manor Spreatty that has  
been given to my Grand Daughter should die before she should get prospect of  
him then there is to be four Hundred £ to be raised by Mervt, Mervt  
& Crosby & Jessie, which four Hundred Dollars I give my Grand Daughter Jessie  
upon the same terms & conditions as I provided for her in the 5<sup>th</sup> section  
of this my will respecting the manor Spreatty.

I do hereby constitute & appoint my two Sons Mervt & Maddison my executors  
to this my last Will & Testament. In Testimony whereof these presents
