

with M. Holland, and her husband, James M. Holland, then it is my will and desire that the negro girl Annet and all her increase if any shall be equally divided between my Daughters Elizabeth Holland's children to them and their heirs forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Laura Ann Gay the tract of land whereon I now live containing by estimation five hundred and thirty eight acres more or less with one Stall, Applemill, and cash valued by me at one thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

6th I leave to my daughter Elizabeth M. Holland after my decease one negro man named Jordan, also one negro woman named Lydia to her during her life and if she should die before her husband Jas M. Holland then I leave the said above negroes to him his life and after the death of both Elizabeth and James M. Holland, then I will and desire that the said negroes shall belong to my daughter Elizabeth M. Holland's children to them and their heirs forever.

I wish I have set a value on each of the above named negroes. The man Jordan at seven hundred dollars the woman Lydia three hundred dollars. I also leave my daughter Elizabeth M. Holland the sum of three hundred dollars which is to go the same way that the above named negroes.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son Harrison D. Moore after my decease one negro man named Solomon valued by me at one thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Laura Ann Gay after my death one negro man named Melan valued by me at Eight hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my daughter Salina F. Daughtrey after my death one negro boy named Jack valued by me at five hundred dollars also one named Caleb valued by me at three hundred dollars, to her and her heirs forever. I also give to my daughter Salina F. Daughtrey the sum of two hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate.

Item 10th It is my will and desire after all the above legacies that I have given away after my decease is made good and all my just debts paid that the balance of my personalty or estate shall be equally divided between my children namely Harrison D. Moore, Elizabeth M. Holland, Laura Ann Gay and Salina F. Daughtrey.

Item 11th My will and desire is that my son Harrison D. Moore and Salina F. Daughtrey shall receive one hundred and fifty dollars each out of my personal estate before a division takes place this to make them equal with the others in their legacies.

Item 12th and lastly, I appoint my son Harrison D. Moore one my sons in law William C. Gay and Solomon S. Daughtrey Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made. Given under my hand and seal this 9th day of February A.D. 1854.
