

both M. Holland, and her husband, James M. Holland, then it is my will and desire that the negro girl Harriet and all her increase if any shall be equally divided between my Daughters Elizabeth Hollands children to them and their heirs forever.

Item 5th. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Laura Amt Gay the tract of land wherein blues lies containing of estimation five hundred and thirty eight acres more or less with one Plat, appledown, and each valued by me at one thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever.

6th I leave to my daughter Elizabeth M. Holland after my decease one negro man named Jordan, also one negro woman named Lydia to her during her life and if she should die before her husband Jas Holland then I leave the said above negroes to him his wife and after the death of both Elizabeth and James M. Holland, then I will and desire that the said negroes shall belong to my daughter Elizabeth M. Holland's children to them and their heirs forever. So wish I have set a value on each of the abovenamed negroes. The man Jordan at seven hundred dollars the woman Lydia three hundred dollars. I also leave my daughter Elizabeth Holland the sum of three hundred dollars which is to go the same way that the above named negroes. Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son Harrison D. Moore after my decease one nego. man named Tolomer valued by me at one thousand dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Laura Amt Gay after my decease one negro man named Tolomer valued by me at Eight hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever.

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my daughter Salina F. Daugtter after my decease one negro boy named Jack valued by me at five hundred dollars also one named Calif valued by me at three hundred dollars, to her and her heirs forever. I also give to my daughter Salina F. Daugtter the sum of two hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate.

Item 10th It is my will and desire after all the above legacies that I have given away after my decease is made good but all my just debts paid that the balance of my property & estate shall be equally divided between my children namely Harrison D. Moore, Elizabeth M. Holland, Laura Amt Gay and Salina F. Daugtter.

Item 11th My will and desire is that my son Harrison D. Moore and Salina F. Daugtter shall receive one hundred and fifty dollars each out of my personal estate before a division takes place. This to make them equal with the others in their legacies.

Item 12th and lastly, I appoint my son Harrison D. Moore and my sons in law William E. Gay and Solomon S. Daugtter Executives of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me hitherto made. Given under my hand and seal this 9th day of January A.D. 1855.
