this to be my last will and testament:  
Having no visible property or estate to dispose of, but having many claims in  
England which may be realized and become of value I hereby will & declare  
that the said claims if recovered shall be disposed of by my Executors herein  
after named in the manner hereinafter to be directed by me.  
In the first place my Executors are directed to pay all claims & judgments as  
Executions against me individually and the remainder to be divided among all my  
children per capita and whatever residue of my estate there may be I hereby give  
and bequeath absolutely to my sister Mary Ann Little of her heirs  
and I hereby constitute and appoint my friends, Abraham Nieldick and John  
Shelby, of Salisbury County, Executors of this my last will and testament.  
In Mecklenburg County, Virginia, I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of Nov 1856.
