And I give and bequeath unto my son George W. Bradshaw at my death on this part of my land, on this part of my chattel &c. and after the death of my wife Martha Bradshaw I give to my son George W. Bradshaw all my land lying on the north side of the road, so that the road may be the dividing line between him and my daughter Mariah. I also give unto my son George W. And I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friend James Griffen as my whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament nothing all other will. In witness whereof, I the said Albin Bradshaw have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fourth day of December 1856.
