I further give and bequeath to her the said Elizabeth Brown all the personal or chattel property of mine which may or shall be found on her said lands before giving to her at the time of my death of every kind whatsoever and I further give and bequeath to the said Elizabeth Brown a considerable part of the lands which I purchased of Dorothy Lovell, say that part of said land lying on the west side of a certain rail fence fully making said fence alone thereby marking perhaps some four or five acres of land which I purchased of the lessee of Holley Rurill senior deceased which fence is erected and stands as I suppose at least the most of it a little east of a north corner from the Chappel road so called the the lands formerly owned by Thomas Howson deceased along said Howson line of marked trees near a west corner to Miles McConnell's land same course along S.E. Miles line to the land formerly owned by Dera McConnell deceased. Then nearly a north west corner it now being said Miles McConnell line to the said Chappel road then north and east corner along said road to the beginning supposed to contain about one hundred acres of land. I further give and bequeath to the said Elizabeth Brown my Veile or Jersey belonging together with the best set of suitable Harness to said Blaggart, also the Bagman & all increase raim & food or by said man, and I further give and bequeath to said Elizabeth Brown cash or good Bonds to the amount of two hundred dollars this sum as well as all the above unforseen gifts to her the said Elizabeth Brown and to her heirs and assigns forever.

5thly. I give and bequeath to George Hunt who has also served me as an apprentice the sum of three hundred dollars in good Bonds or money to him and to his heirs forever.

6thly. I give and bequeath to Thomas Hunt who has served me as an apprentice the lands which I purchased of Dorothy Draper, Elizabett Draper and wife, James Draper and wife, Samuel Barnes and wife, it being the land wherein James Griffin now lives say Sept 1st 1856, supposed to contain about one hundred and fifty acres. Bounded by the lands of James Barting say the run of the Cypress Swamp that is to say the swamp to Matilda Dryden's land along said swamp to John R. Rockhill's land, thus leaving said swamp nearly a south course along said Rockhill's line of marked trees of various courses or directions to William Draper's land then said Draper's line of marked trees to Susan Griffin's land then said Griffin's line of marked trees to the land on which Caleb Tracy now lives say Sept 1st 1856, then nearly and east course alone of marked trees to the run of the before named Cypress Swamp as will also alio for James Read, which lands and appurtenances thereunto belonging I further give to the aforesaid Thomas Hunt, to him and to his heirs and assigns forever. I further give and bequeath to the said Thomas Hunt the lot of land wherein Jonathan S. Griffin now lives say Sept 1st 1856, beginning at the fork of Bow's road westward and said road so called, thence along Bow's road a northeast course or nearly so to Horatio B. Carter's land then near a south course mostly alone of marked trees to said fencehead, thence along said road so far as to become parallel with alone of marked trees to designate the line and of a certain acre of land deed by myself to trustees of the Episcopal Church called Methodist who do or ought to know the other boundaries of said acre of land on which said house stands from the corner the center of said fenceline parallel to the above named a corner for the heirs of Josiah McConnell then nearly an east course along said house line so far and no farther than a straight course directly out the east end of a fenceline running in part inclosing the house and small lot of land sit and on which said house now lies, say 1st Sept 1856, further said lot is inclosed by fence clearly on the north end of said lot fence.
