

and to his heirs and assigns forever and in addition to the sum of twenty Dollars given to my
 woman Julia I give & bequeath to her the further sum of Fifty Dollars in money to her
 to her heirs & assigns forever. And to my woman Jenny I bequeath the further sum of Fifty Dollars in money to her
 to her heirs and assigns forever. I made provision in the 20th Section of my will
 for a part of my slaves to be hired out, which provision and every part of it I hereby
 revoke.

As it relates to the Land given to Sallie F. Bown in the 18th Section of my will I perhaps
 was not as explicit as I might have been, therefore I will if possible make that
 part of my will more plain & explicit by saying that if the said Sallie F. Bown
 dies leaving no issue of her own body then in that case I give & bequeath that
 land & every part of it to be equally divided between James Hunt, Elizabeth Bown,
 the wife of James, George Hunt & Thomas Hunt to them & their heirs & assigns forever.
 And lastly I give & bequeath the residue of my estate to be equally divided between the fol-
 lowing named persons to-wit: James Baines my nephew, Wm. J. Samuel Baines and their
 sister, Elizabeth Lane, the children of Josiah Baines, Narcissa, Emeline, Jonathan,
 & Samuel Griffith, the children of James Griffith by his first marriage Elizabeth alias
 Oly. a Newton. All the children of Thomas & Sallie Corbett whose maiden name was
 Baines, all the children of Samuel & Elizabeth M. Corbett whose maiden name was
 Baines the children of John C. Baines of Iowa & the sons of my Brother Benjamin
 Baines.

Again my will as in this codicil I request my nephew James Baines of Whitfield County
 North Carolina and Elizabeth D. Durham of Southampton County, State of Virginia
 to be the executors of this my will to my last will and testament and I hereby
 nominate & appoint them for that purpose.

And in witness of this being a codicil to my last will & testament I hereunto set
 my hand & affix my seal this first day of February One Thousand eight hundred
 & fifty seven.

 two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and the codicil thereto was proved by the oath of Bennett,
 Wm. J. Burt & Samuel Daughtery, the subscribing witnesses thereto and Bampton ordered
 & sealed. And Elizabeth D. Durham one of the executors therein named having refused to
 take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof, On the motion of James
 Baines the other executor therein named who made oath and together with C. D. Backus
 Henry Cook his securities entered into and acknowledged above in the penalty of thirty
 thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted the said
 James Baines for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form.
