In the Name of God, Amen: I, Wm. J. Schell of the County of Southampton and State of Va., do make this my last will and testament as follows

1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son James E. Schell all the Lands in the Parish of the County of Southampton and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son George W. Schell all of my lots and Lands in Town of Jerusalem say the lot I bought of Doct. J. D. Bishop and the Store house and Office I bought under a decree of Southampton Circuit Court also one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Wm. Nicholas Schell the House wherein I now live about four hundred acres of Land adjoining of it to him provide he live to 21 years old or have a lawful heir but in the event of his death before he is 21 years old the said land of House, I give unto my son Benjamin Waller Schell if he should live to be 21 years old but if he should die before he is 21 years old it is to belong to my son John Nathl. Schell. I also give unto my son Wm. Nicholas Schell one negro man Friday, one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son John Nathaniel Schell the Lands where John M. Williams now lives (at the death of Rebecca Williams) it being her share of S. W. Simmons est.) and two hundred and fifty acres of Land lying on the road in front of Mr. Wm. H. Nicholas (called the road
