To the County Court of Southampton County.

Your Commissioner reports to the Court that on the 22^d day of April 1854 C.D. Barham (Adminis'trator of W.C. Barham dec'd) exhibited before your Commissioner, a statement of all the money which the said C.D. Barham had received as become chargeable which he had disbursed within the said ending the 21st day of April 1854, together with the vouchers and disbursements. That the Commissioner reviewed the said administrator's return in the last of the said year, when accounts were before him for settlement, which was posted at the front door of the Courtroom said County, on the first day of May Court last, and on the date of this report (ten days having elapsed since the said account was mentioned in the said list) made up and completed the foregoing account of the said C.D. Barham's administration on the estate of the said W.C. Barham dec'd and on the 21st day of April 1854, finds a balance of \$1100.69 due from the administrator all principal with interest thereon from that date. The account is supported by satisfactory vouchers and is herewith returned.

Your Commissioner further reports to the Court that he has examined whether the said administrator has given each bond as the law requires and whether it is in openalty and surety sufficient and finds the same to be unquestionable and fully sufficient.
