

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 21st day of September 1857
 The last Will and testament of Grace Holland dec^d was proved by the oaths of
 George Dixton and William Gardner the subscribing witnesses thereto and the oaths of
 others to be recorded. And in the matter of Alan McArthur the executor
 named who made oath and together with Eliza Dixon and James Youngman his ex-
 ecutors (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged
 a bond in the penalty of Two hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs.
 And aforesaid is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form
 of Law.
