At a Court held for the County of Southampton, May 17th, 1858.
In due course, the one bearing date February 1st 1856, and the other without date, purporting to be the last will and testament of Elijah Parker deceased were presented, and there being no subscriber witness thereto, Benjamin E. Rose and Nathaniel S. Francis being sworn, deposed and say, that they are well acquainted with the handwriting of said Elijah Parker deceased. Whereupon the said writing was ordered to be recorded as the true last will and testament of Elijah Parker deceased. And as the widow Mrs. S. Francis who made oath and testified with Nathaniel S. Francis, his son-in-law (who gave his son's oath as to their sufficiency) entered into an acknowledgment above in the penalty of Twenty five hundred dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted thereto D^r S. Francis for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of said Elijah Parker deceased with her will annexed in due form.

I, Jeptha Branch (JN) after the County of Southampton being weak of body, but of sound mind & memory do make this to be my last will and testament in form and manner following:

1st I wish all my just debts & funeral expenses paid.

2nd I give to my wife Fanny Branch one hundred pounds in cash in two barrels bond, to her heirs forever.

3rd I give to my daughter Lucy a slave belonging to Mr. Braggett one thousand dollars to her heirs forever.

4th I give to my daughter Lucy a slave belonging to Mr. Banot one thousand dollars to her heirs forever.

5th I give all the balance of my property of my self and both real & personal to Julian J. Branch to him & his heirs forever with this special request that he shall not sell the land but keep it in possession of himself & his family during their lives.

Last^y, I constitute and appoint my friend Julian J. Branch Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me hitherto made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of May 1857
