I, Joseph T. M. Summell of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, being perfectly aware of the uncertainty of life, do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament - My wife during her natural ^{life}, I wish to remain in possession of my estate, and at her death to dispose of Two thousand dollars in my manner that she may wish; I also give her one hundred & fifty dollars to purchase a carriage - Secondly I give to Richard N. Branch's children eight hundred dollars, this to be paid by my executor or soon as the money can be made without the forced sale of property for that purpose.

3rd - At the death of my wife, I desire that two thirds of my estate should be divided between the children of my Brother George C. Summell, the remainder to be equally divided between the children of my two half sisters Julia Andrews wife of Stephen Andrews and Caroline Branch wife of Richard Branch.

I leave my Brother George C. Summell my executor during his life after the settlement of my estate to superintend the farm with a salary of two hundred dollars per annum after the money has been made from the estate. I also give him full powers to sell any one of my negroes should they prove refractory and deposit the money in some bank, also any stock that may not be needed - I also give to S. B. Kello five dollars - I hereunto affix my hand and seal, this 25th day of June A.D. 1888.
