To the County Court of Southampton.

Your Commissioner reports to Court that Oliver H. Inman the Administrator of Elizabeth Fennant has exhibited before him a statement of all money received by the said Administrator or with which he had become chargeable or had disbursed during the periods embraced in the foregoing account together with the number and support of the disbursements. That he finds a balance of \$248.51 left due by the said Administrator to the said estate on the 18th day of August 1858, with interest at \$248.29 past thereof from that day.
