

Item 1st I give to my son William M. Sackel all of my landed estate and one bed and furniture.
 Item 2nd I give to my son Robert M. Sackel my negro man John and one bed and furniture.
 Item 3rd I give to my son James Sackel seven hundred dollars worth of bonds from the 1st day of January 1858.

Item 4th The balance of my estate I will sell and the money arising therefrom after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses to be equally divided between my three sons above named.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my three sons, James, Robert and William Sackel, Executors of my last will. In testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 4th day of December 1857.

Lacy Sackel (Seal)

At a Court held for the County of Southampton, October 17th 1859.

This last will and testament of Lacy Sackel dec'd. was fully proved by the oath of James C. Selus, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and the same is continued for further proof. And as a Court held for the said County, November 21st 1859. This last will and testament of Lacy Sackel dec'd. was this day wholly proved by the oath of Wm. C. Selus another subscribing witness thereto and was ordered to be recorded by Robert M. and William M. Sackel two of the executors thereinafter named appeared in Court and request to take upon themselves any part of the burden of the execution thereof, on the motion of James S. Sackel the other executor thereinafter named, who made oath (and together with Robert M. Sackel and William M. Sackel his executors, who justly and as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond with penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned according to law, that estate is granted to the said James S. Sackel for so holding a probate of the said will in due form.

I, Rebecca Shumard, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit:

Item 1st After the payment of my just debts I give to my nephew Henry D. Mayles my negro man Matt. Three hundred dollars that I have owned him a young male, a year of age now aged and add and give to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2nd I give to my sister Lacy Sackel my bed and furniture, bureau and a cash dress to her and her heirs forever.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to Edward Mayles a little jewelry which he already has.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to William Mayles my gold watch (and a band).

Item 5th I give and bequeath the residue of my estate to be equally divided between my nephews, James M. and Henry D. Mayles to them and their heirs forever. And I leave my nephew Henry D. Mayles my apartment, but all things whereof I have set my hand and seal by deed, this first day of July 1859.
