 of the importance of life, do hereby make this to be my last will and testament, revoking all that
 in former wills - viz: I give to my dear Brother, Samuel D. Kello, the same in which
 I now reside, all my my negroes, excepting my wife Rebecca and negro boy Ellick - all of
 my chattel estate not herein after mentioned. I wish my Executor to see his executor
 and if he thinks best keep thereat two negroes as he can viz: Rebecca and
 Ellick and sell the same and pay my just debts, provided he is able first to
 the price it may bring, if not, I wish the said boy can get sold for cash. I
 give my mill and fixtures and the lands belonging thereto, to Samuel Kello,
 son of my brother Samuel D. Kello.

I give to Richard Henry Kello son of my brother Samuel D. Kello my gold watch
 and chain and also my single barrel gun.

4th I give to my friend Exum & Spicer, my double barrel gun.

5th I wish and request that my Executor put Washington Cumples to some good trade and
 he becomes twenty one years of age then I give him in cash Ten hundred and fifty
 Dollars.

6th I apprehend and of my estate enough to have the Family Grave yard paid having
 also I wish it funded.

7th I appoint my brother Samuel D. Kello my Executor for the purpose of settling
 my estate and carrying into effect my will into effect. Given under my hand the 1st
 day of July, in the year of our Lord 1868.
