To the County Court of Southampton County.

Your Commissioned reports & account that Richard D. L. Arnold has of late before him a statement of all moneys received by the said Administrator as well as what he has become chargeable or had disbursed during the period embraced in the foregoing account together with the balance in support of the said instruments. That he finds a balance of \$128.84 to be due by the said Administrator to the said estate on the 19th day of April 1859, with interest thereon from that day.
