

4th After the death of my wife I give Dwise and Pequack mt. my son William W. Draper All my land and the one third part of my estate to him his heirs and assigns forever. If she survives he is at liberty then to take charge of the two thirds of my land if he chooses.

Lastly, I do hereby authorize, constitute and appoint Jeremiah Chapell whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament. Whence I have unto set my hand and seal Day of January 16. 1859.
