Item 4th It is my will and desire that my whole estate not already disposed of to be sold on a reasonable credit (and out of the money arising from said sales that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, and the balance of the money arising from such sales to be equally divided between my three daughters, (namely) Margaret R. Barker, Maria J. Barker, and Julia A. Barker to them and their heirs forever.
