

out of my estate.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my friend Orman M. Bryant the sum of two hundred Dollars to him and to his heirs forever.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Edmy Whitley all of my tract of Land whereon I now reside containing by estimation 200 acres more or less to her at her disposal forever.

Item 4th I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Edmy Whitley one tract of Land known as the Stantly place containing 275 acres more or less adjoining the land belonging to the Heirs of Wm. E. Williams and others, to her at her disposal forever.

Item 5th I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Edmy Whitley one tract of Land lying in the State of North Carolina Hatteras County known as the Higgins place adjoining the Land of Samuel D. Winborn and others, also one tract of Land lying in Hatteras County known as the Whitley place adjoining the land belonging to the Heirs of Mary Wilks Deceased to her at her disposal forever.

Item 6. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife Edmy Whitley all the balance of my Estate not otherwise disposed of above to her at her disposal forever.

7th. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Orman M. Bryant Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 4th fourth day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and sixty one 1861.
