J. M. A. Ramsay In the name of God, Amen! I Sarah M. A. Ramsay of the County of South-
ampton and State of Virginia, do make and publish this to be my last Will
and testament in manner and form following (that is to say):
Item the 1st I give and bequeath Fifty Dollars to be paid annually, in
sums of Six Dollars by my Executor until the fund is exhausted to aid
in supporting the Methodist Protestant Minister who may preach yearly
at Parson's Church.
Item the 2nd I give, devise and bequeath the sum of one hundred Dollars to
the Virginia Aid Society of the Virginia Conference of the Methodist
Protestant Church, the same to be paid by my Executor to the Treasurer
of said Society to be used for its beneficiaries.
Item the 3rd It is my desire that my brother John W. P. Westbrook's
widow Mary J. Westbrook and her children shall remain on the plantation
which I purchased of him; and therefore I loan the said Land and all other
property which may be on the abovenamed place at my death to the said
Mary J. Westbrook during her natural life, or as long as she remains
my Brother John W. P. Westbrook's widow for the benefit of herself
and children. At the termination of such loan I then give the
Land and all other property therein to be equally divided among the
children of the said John W. P. Westbrook and Mary, his wife,
to them and their heirs forever.
Item the 4th It is my desire that the land which I purchased at the death of my
Father Jacob Ramsay which Land formerly belonged to my mother Lucy
Clair before her marriage with my Father and also the Surmount tract
adjoining it be sold after due notice by my Executor, and all other
property which I may have at my death which is not included
in the before mentioned bequests, the money shall be equally divided into
two parts, one of which shall be equally divided among my sister Eliza-
beth S. M. Lemons children, and the other part divided equally among
the children of my brother John W. P. Westbrook, which shall be paid
to them by my Executor when they arrive at a lawful age to receive it.
I further provide that my Executor shall pay annually the interest of the money
to my sister Elizabeth S. M. Lemons (bequeathed by me to her children) until
