Virginia do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following, test.
First I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Jackson, Freddony Jackson and Martha Jackson daughters
of Ammon Jackson all of my tract^s of land to them and their heirs forever. Should if either of said
children should die before they arrive the age of twenty one then they surviving ones shall have her part
her part of said land.

Second. I give and bequeath unto John H. James son of Francis James five hundred dollars money
or good bonds.

Third. I loan to James R Joyner the following. negro woman Hannah and her two children and future
increase his life and at his death they are to be free - My negro man Stephen I give and
bequeath unto said James R Joyner - the balance of my estate after paying my just debts
I give and bequeath unto Mark A James and William A Joyner to be equally divided between
them -

Lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint Mark A James and William A Joyner Executors to this
my last will and testament - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 25th day of April 1861.

This last Will and Testament of George T James dec^d was proved by the oaths of J. C. J. Turner and Jno. T. Branch

Joyner the executors thereto named who made oath and together with Thomas McNewson their security (who justified
on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of six thousand dollars conditioned
as the law directs certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form -
