In the name of God, Amen, I Jesse Little of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and declare this to be my last Will and testament in manner and following to wit:

1st I give and devise to my daughter Mary J. Cobb the plantation on which she now resides, it being the land I bought of Bailey Bryant and a small portion of the land of William J. Cobb and is bounded as follows, beginning at a stream on the Otterway River and running thence a new line to a pine - which was an elbow formerly for the land I bought of Bailey Bryant and the land that I bought of William J. Cobb - and by the lands I bought of William J. Cobb and John W. Burley, by the lands of James A. Gillette and by the land that Daniel W. Cobb bought of Selvy Cobb and by Henry Whitehead's land, and contains five hundred and twenty acres, more or less
