

also the following slaves to wit. I shew that I bought of Joseph Parsons estate, Harrison that I bought of John W. Gurley, Margaret & Louisa and their children and the future increase of said slaves, all of which she has now in her possession, and a woman named Emma and child which is in my possession, and his future increase - all of which property I give to my said daughter Mary J. Cobb and her heirs forever.

2^d. I give and devise to my son Theophilus G. Little the plantation on which I at present reside, it being the land that I bought of River Barker and the land I bought of George A. W. Hudson, it being the piece that I cut off for my son Edward M. Little, and a portion of the land that I bought of Bailey Bryant's estate lying on the North side of Nottoway River and bounded as follows. Beginning at a Horn-beam at Nottoway River which was line formerly for Jacob Bryant and Bailey Bryant, and running thence to a black gum in Susan Woolfords line - which is a corner for the tract that I bought of Jacob Bryant and for the said piece I bought of Bailey Bryant's estate, and supposed to contain in all five hundred and ninety acres, more or less, also the following slaves, to wit, the blacksmith Eli, Mr. Harrison, Mrs. George Franky and her children and an old woman Dianah, and the future increase of said slaves. all of which property I give to my said son Theophilus G. and his heirs forever.

3^d. I give and devise to my son Edward M. Little the following tracts of land, to wit. the tract I bought of Peter Simmonds, the tract I bought of William S. Williams. the tract I bought of Joseph Downing, the tract I bought of Jacob Bryant, the tract I bought of John W. Gurley, the tract I bought of William J. Cobb (except a piece that I cut off for my daughter Mary J. Cobb), the tract I bought of Thomas H. Urquhart and a part of the land I bought of Bailey Bryant's estate lying on the North side of Nottoway River below the Andrew Seines place and a small piece cut off the Hudson tract. Supposed to be two or three acres more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a maple, a corner formerly for River Barker in my line and running thence a new line to a white oak, an elbow, where it strikes the old line - supposed to contain in all the said tracts Eight hundred acres more or less - also the following slaves to wit, little Davy, the blacksmith Davy that I bought of Edmund Holcomb, Nat. Ephraim, Gilbert and Caroline and her two youngest children Viz. Amanda, Martha, Blaney, Spratley, Roberta and Lucy and an old woman Jerry, and the future increase of said slaves and one horse of the value of one hundred and fifty dollars, all of the bricks and sawed timber remaining on the plantation - all of which property I give to my son Edward M. Little and his heirs forever.

4^d. I give and devise to my daughter Anna E. Gurley the plantation in which I formerly lived (except one hundred including the burying-ground) Supposed to contain two hundred and forty five acres, more or less, also negro men Tom that I bought of Sampson Little's estate now in his possession and also the following negroes to wit, Tom that I bought of John W. Gurley, Bain, Dick, Matilda, and her children and their future increase and one hundred barrels Corn - all of which property I give to my said daughter Anna E. and her heirs forever -

5^d. Should either or any of the negroes which I have given to my daughter Anna E. die before those to whom they are given get in possession of them, I desire that the places of their dying be supplied with other negroes of equal value.

6^d. I desire that my cider casks, stills, forges &c. be equally divided between my two sons Theophilus G. Edward M. & my daughter Anna E. I also give to my said two sons Theophilus G. & Edward each, one hundred barrels of corn, one yoke of oxen and one yoked and furnished all to be of their own choice. I wish that the out-hands on the different plantations remain as they are and belong to those to whom the plantation on which they are, are given -

I desire that the balance of my negroes not herein before given away be equally divided among my children & their descendants. I furthermore desire that all the balance of chattel what be sold and after my just debts paid the balance of the money equally divided among my surviving children.

I desire that the negroes which my son Edward M. Little shall be entitled to at my death be settled on the plantation I have herein before given him and that he shall have the management of all of his property without any guardian.

I nominate, constitute and appoint Littleton R. Edwards and my son Theophilus G. Little Executors of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby revoke and declare void all other wills or Testaments by me hitherto made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 7th
