

I Nancy Turner of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say.

Item 1st I hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret L Turner one bedstead bed and good furniture to same, one set of china ware, one trunk and also the sum of twenty five dollars in cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item 2nd I hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Johnson consort of John D Johnson one dollar in cash to her and her heirs forever, she already having received from my estate sufficient to make her equal as a legatee.

Item 3rd I hereby give and bequeath to my son Harris Turner one dollar in cash to him and his heirs forever, he having received from my estate enough to make him equal as legatee to my son John Turner whose legacy is to be hereafter named.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son John Turner my filly, bridle and saddle, bedstead, bed and furniture to same also fifty dollars in cash to him and his heirs forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret L Turner and my son John Turner after the payment of my just debts all the remainder of my estate consisting of household and kitchen furniture, stock of all kinds, monies, bonds and all the rest of my property of every sort and kind not mentioned above to be equally divided between them to have and to hold the same to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son John Turner my sole executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made made by me. As Witness I have my hand and seal this the 21st day of August 1857.
