

In the name of God, Amen. I Robert M Wrenn of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following.

- 1<sup>st</sup>. I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
- 2<sup>nd</sup>. I desire that all the property I may own at the time of my death may be sold and distributed as I shall herein after direct.
- 3<sup>rd</sup>. I desire that my negro man Williams may be sold to Thomas J Wrenn if he wants him and said negro wishes to live with him, and that the said Thomas J Wrenn shall have ample time to pay for him.
- 4<sup>th</sup>. After the payment of all my just debts I desire the distribution of my estate as follows. To Anna E Alice A. & Eugenia P Pennington the sum of fifty dollars each, to them and their heirs forever.
- 5<sup>th</sup>. I desire that the remainder of my estate be equally divided between brothers Andrew J Wrenn & Edward M Wrenn and my sister Martha A. E Shweatt to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint James H Mangum Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of May 1864.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of November 1862. This last Will and Testament of Robert M Wrenn dec<sup>d</sup> was this day proved by the oaths of J R Edwards and R J Darden the subscribing witnesses thereto and thereupon ordered to be recorded and on the motion of James H Mangum the executor therein named who made oath and together with Thomas J Wrenn and Fortunatus Dunn his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
