

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17th day of November 1862. Edwin Daughtrey
 This last Will and Testament of James Wills de^d was this day proved by the oaths of J. A. Seay, Joshua Drumpler and Edwin Daughtrey the subscribing witnesses thereto and thereupon ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Edward W. Massenburg the executor therein named who made oath and together with James D. Massenburg and William W. Cobb his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty five thousand dollars, conditioned according to law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate of the said will in due form.

I Mordecai Bradshaw of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do on this 21st day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine make and constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament in manner as follows. That is to say I lend to my wife Amy J. Bradshaw the plantation we now live on as long as she live my widow in case she marries or dies then give it David Lawrence Bradshaw my Baby I lend every thing on the farm to my wife to stand like it does if she remains my widow as long as she lives my widow to keep the children together and raise them until they become 21 years of age and if they should be any thing raised more than them they consume I want it equaled divided amongst my six children. I give Sarah Bradshaw at the age of twenty years one thousand dollars her choice bed and clock I give unto Mordecai Shaukins Bradshaw at the age of 21 years one thousand dollars one bed and my horses Charles and desk. I give unto William Henry Bradshaw at the age of twenty one years one thousand dollars and one bed and one horse boston and side board. I give to Martha Masouva Bradshaw Eleven hundred and fifty dollars one bed and press at the age of 21 years. I give Susan Saludy Bradshaw Eleven hundred dollars and the tracks of land known as the Stafney land and table and bed at the age of 21 years I give the farm named above David Lawrence Bradshaw at the age of twenty one years he is to have the farm at the death of his mother or marriage and as they all have a share in it until free or death of Mother or marriage I give David Lawrence five hundred dollars to work for him his free and one bed half dozen chairs and my horse Phillip. I want every thing kept together as long as my wife lives my widow unless they thought it best to sell of a portion within themselves at the death of my wife or marriage sell every thing of my personal estate to the mount of money and equaled divided amongst my six children. I nominate my son Mordecai B. Bradshaw my executor I hope his sisters & brothers will help him out. all the money over payin of the children I want it equaled divided among my children I want William David Sarah Martha Susan. I want I want the to do the business free of charge I want all the brothers and sisters to pay the reasonable and help the besides

This my last Will and Testament. all my children provide for this mother to the last cent.

 This writing bearing date the 21st day of June 1859 purporting to be last will and Testament of Mordecai Bradshaw de^d was this day produced to the Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto Willis Bradshaw, Philip Raiford, Tabitha Raiford and Wilbourn Hedgspeth being duly sworn depose and say they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Mordecai Bradshaw de^d and verily believe that the said writing and the name thereto subscribed are wholly in the proper hand writing of the said Mordecai Bradshaw de^d and thereupon the said writing is ordered to be
