In the name of God, Amen, I, N. D. Turner being of sound mind and disposing
 of my body, do make this as my last Will and Testament, as follows. (that is to say) after my
 just debts shall have been paid -

1st I give and bequeath unto my three brothers George W. Benjamin G. and James E. P.
 Turner three fourths of my property of every kind and description, both other corporal or incor-
 poral, real personal or mixed, lands, tenements, or hereditaments to have and to hold forever, the said
 three fourths to be divided and held not in common, but severally.

2nd I give to my Sister Martha S. E. Jones, for the term of her natural life the remaining one
 fourth of my estate of every description, and at her death it is to be equally divided among her
 children living at that time to have and to hold forever.

I desire my Uncle E. P. Turner should act as my Executor. In Witness whereof I have set
 my hand and seal this eighteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty one.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 15th day of December 1862
 This last Will and Testament of N. D. Turner ^{deceased} was this day proved by the oath of Ben. F.
 Vick one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and continued for further proof. And at a Court held
 for the said County on the 19th day of January 1863, the said will was again produced in Court and
 John Barham the other subscribing witness thereto being dead John M. Gurley being sworn deposed and
 said he is well acquainted with the hand writing of the said John Barham and verily believed that
 the name of the said John Barham to the said will subscribed as a witness is in the proper hand
 writing of the said Jno. Barham. whereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded and on the
 motion of Edward P. Turner the executor therein named who made oath and together with Joseph H.
 Blaund & Edwin Harris his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and
 acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certifi-
 cated and granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form

 return from service that Elliott L. Ferguson should act as my executor to sell the
 above mentioned property and collect what may be due my decease. I further desire after
