At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 16th day of February 1863. This writing bearing date the 26th day of July 1856. purporting the last will and testament of Wilson Willons dec^d was produced in Court and there being no subscribing witness thereto Shugars Cain being sworn deposes and says he is well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Wilson Willons and verily believes the said writing and the signature thereto are wholly in the hand writing of the said Wilson Willons dec^d. Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last will and testament of the said Wilson Willons dec^d. and on the motion of Shugars Cain who made oath and together with Meris J. Davis and David H. Joyner his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Wilson Willons dec^d with his will aforesaid annexed in due form.

In the name of God, Amen: I John Hines of the County of Southampton and State of Virg^a: being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, do make and declare this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills and testaments.

Art. 1st: I give unto my son John Burton Hines all the land I own lying between the Colbraw road and lightwood swamp to make him equal with the others, he to have possession of the same immediately after my death.

Art. 2. Having given unto Mansfield and Solomon Hines and Manerva White each three hundred dollars, I now give unto Sylvanus Hines fifty dollars, unto Christohair one hundred dollars, and to Evilda three hundred dollars to make them equal to the three mentioned above.

Art. 3. After my death, I direct a sufficiency of my chattle estate to be sold to pay my just debts and funeral expenses and the balance of my property, I leave to my wife Martha Hines during her life or widowhood, and then all the property of which she may die seized and possessed, both real, personal and mixed to be sold at public sale, and the same after paying all expenses, to be equally divided between my children and their heirs, giving unto my son John Burton one hundred dollars over and above an equal share to build him a house &c.

Art. 4th I appoint and constitute Solomon Hines and Sylvanus Hines my Exors^s to this my last will and testament and in the event of them in battle or from disease, then Meris J. Davis - Given under my hand and seal this 11th day of December 1862.
